How to care for your Meridian

Cleaning Instructions

Stainless Steel Meridian (gold in colour)

• Clean your instrument once a week with a microfibre cleaning cloth and the stainless steel cleaning liquid that you received with your Meridian to remove finger prints and other stains. Spray the liquid on the outside of your instrument a couple of times and wipe it gently off in a circular motion with a clean cloth.

• Both the cleaning cloth and the stainless steel cleaner are readily available online should you need to purchase more.

Nitrided Steel Meridian (purple in colour)

• Clean your instrument once a week with isopropyl alcohol using a microfibre cleaning cloth. After that, apply a thin layer of a handpan oil of your choice. We recommed using Pheonix Oil.

• Alternatively, use the cleaning spray that you received with your instrument instead - spray the liquid on the outside of your instrument a couple of times and wipe it gently off with a clean cloth. This should be done after each playing session.

Care & Maintanance Instructions

- Handle your instrument gently and with care, it is fragile and can get damaged/detuned easily.
- Do not hit the notes with exessive force, the notes on your Meridian will resonate fully when a correct technique is applied with a gentle touch. We recommend playing with one finger at a time to make the notes of your Meridian sing.
- Do not play in the direct sunshine excessive warmth can affect the tuning of your instrument. If you notice that your Meridian is too hot, do not play it until it cools down again.
- Remove your jewelery (rings, bracelets, long necklaces) before playing so as not to scratch your handpan.
- Keep your instrument dry and clean to avoid rust. If it does get wet, clean it properly and keep it out of its case until both the instrument and the case are fully dry.
- Make sure your hands are clean before you start playing your handpan. Fruit acids and other substances might stain your instrument.
- Do not place your instrument directly on hard surfaces, as this will cause scratches. Place your handpan on a cloth or a cushion instead.
